Narcotics Investigation Leads To 2 Arrests

Town of Van Buren, New York – The Onondaga County Sheriff's Office reports that two people are facing drug charges in connection with a narcotics investigation in the Town of Van Buren.

As part of an investigation into illegal narcotics sales, Detectives assigned to the Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Unit, charged Kyle Seaway (35) of 143 Idlewood Blvd, and Adam Millien (32) of 101 Evans Drive, with 2 counts of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 3rd degree, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 7th degree and Unlawful Possession of Marihuana.

Detectives recovered 93 wax paper bags containing suspected Fentanyl, 6 wax paper bags of heroin, 1 gram (approximately 30 doses) of powder heroin, approximately 14 grams of cocaine, 16 narcotic prescription pills (Hydrocodone) and a small quantity of marihuana.

Both men were arraigned today in the Town of Van Buren Court before Judge Darlene O'Kane who set Seaway's bail at \$25,000 cash \$50,000 bond. Bail was denied for Millien, due to having two or more prior felony convictions. He was also arraigned in the City of Syracuse Court on the additional charges of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 3rd degree (5 counts), Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 4th degree, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 7th degree (5 counts), and Unlawful Possession of Marihuana.
