Truck Crashes into House

Town of Tully, New York – The Onondaga County Sheriff's Office reports that sheriff's deputies investigated a motor vehicle crash this morning involving a rubbish removal truck that struck a house on Route 80 in the Town of Tully.

At approximately 10:50 AM this morning, sheriff deputies responded to Route 80 at the intersection with Strong Road, after receiving a 911 call that a rubbish removal truck had struck a house. Deputies investigating the crash report that the operator of a Feher Rubbish Removal Inc. truck, 25 year old Kyle Freeman of Syracuse, was traveling north on Strong Road when he failed to stop for a stop sign at the intersection of Route 80. The truck continued across Route 80 where he left the roadway and struck a house located at 4883 Route 80. The impact from that collision caused significant damage to the house and it took crews several hours to remove the truck from the home. Freeman told deputies that the brakes failed on the truck as he was coming down the hill on Strong Road.

Freeman sustained a minor leg injury and was treated at the scene. The homeowner, who was inside the house at the time of the crash, was not injured.

Deputies continue to investigate the crash.
