Traffic Stop Leads to Drug Arrest

City of Syracuse, New York – The Onondaga County Sheriff's Office reports that Sheriff's Deputies assigned to the Gun Involved Violence Elimination unit (GIVE), recover drugs and money during traffic stop on the city's west side.

On Saturday evening, at approximately 7:07 pm, deputies patrolling the 200 block of Rowland Street conducted a traffic stop on a 2009 Chevrolet Malibu after noticing several equipment violations. Upon stopping the vehicle, the driver fled on foot but was taken into custody a short distance away. Subsequent investigation revealed that the driver, identified as Kalik McMillan (22) of Syracuse, was found in possession of 207 bags of heroin, 2 grams of cocaine, 7 oxycodone pills, 2 grams of marijuana and various narcotic equipment.



Deputies charged McMillan with two counts of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the 3rd degree, criminal possession of a controlled substance in the 4th degree, three counts of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the 7th degree, two counts of criminally using drug paraphernalia in the 2nd degree. McMillan was also issued traffic tickets for aggravated unlicensed operation in the 3rd degree, uninspected motor vehicle and window tint. He was lodged overnight in the Justice Center and is expected to be arraigned sometime today. He was arraigned Sunday morning in Syracuse City Court and has since posted bail that was set at \$25,000 cash/ \$50,000 bond.

The Gun Involved Violence Elimination (GIVE) initiative is designed to reduce firearm-related crimes, shootings, and homicides. In addition to the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office, the Syracuse Police Department, County Probation Department and the District Attorney's Office is assigned to the operation.
